## The Four Chaplains

Rev. George Fox, a Methodist minister, Rabbi Alexander Goode, a Jewish rabbi, John Washington, a Roman Catholic priest, and Clark Poling, a Reformed Church in America minister served as chaplains in the Army during World War II and became close friends.

In January 1943 they sailed together on the USAT Dorchester with 900 soldiers and sailors. In the early morning hours of February 3rd, the ship was torpedoed by a German submarine.

The four chaplains calmed everyone in the darkness and helped them find their way on deck, handed out life jackets, and assisted men into lifeboats. When they ran out of life jackets, all four chaplains gave theirs to soldiers and sailors in line.



When no more room was available in the life boats, the four men stayed on board, held hands, and sang hymns as the ship went down. More than 600 men died that night in the frigid seas, but some 230 were rescued. And some of the survivors, in official accounts given to the Army, and in interviews after the war, reported what they saw as the ship went down: Those four chaplains, men of different faiths but believing in the same God, their arms linked, standing on the deck together in prayer.

They had willingly given up their futures, their lives, to try to help the men who had been placed by the Army in their care. Please join in the Four Chaplain Ceremony on 1 February 2015 at 4:00pm.

## "Who can be interned in a National Cemetery?"

Burial in a national cemetery is open to all members of the armed forces and veterans who have met minimum active duty service requirements and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable. Their spouse, widow or widower, minor children, and, under certain conditions, unmarried adult children with disabilities, may also be eligible for burial. Eligible spouses and children may be

buried even if they predecease the veteran. Members of the reserve components of the armed forces who die while on active duty or who die while on training duty, or were eligible for retired pay, may also be eligible for burial.

Burial in a VA national cemetery is a benefit. VA provides the gravesite, opening and closing of the grave, government headstone or marker, U.S. burial flag, Presidential Memorial Certificate, and perpetual care of the gravesite at no cost to the family. The Cape Canaveral National Cemetery is to start accepting burials and cremains in June of 2015. This cemetery will serve 163,000 veterans in a 75 mile radius of Scottsmoor, Florida just north of Titusville. 






## **ABATE Merritt Island Toy Run**
