Did you know that the 4th of July has only been a paid federal holiday since 1941? It's true, but patriotic Americans have been celebrating the birth of our Country for a lot longer than that!

The 4th of July – or Independence Day commemorates the formal adoption of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress on the 4th of July in 1776. The City of Philadelphia started

the annual celebration of the event the very next year even though the war to secure our independence was still going on. And in 1781, Massachusetts became the first to make the 4th an official state holiday several months before the key American victory over the British at Yorktown.

Interestingly we may actually be celebrating on the wrong day! John Adams, the second President of the United States, believed that the holiday should be celebrated on the 2nd of July, the date that the Continental Congress voted in favor of the resolution proposed by Robert Henry Lee and elegantly documented by the five-man committee led by Thomas Jefferson, that the colonies declare their complete independence from Great Britain. Adams maintained his belief throughout his presidency and the remainder of his life, reportedly turning down invitations to events scheduled on the 4th in protest. In an ironic twist John Adams and Thomas Jefferson would both die on the 4th of July in 1826 – the 50th anniversary.

Today we celebrate the 4th of July with summer picnics and family barbeques – we bask in the freedoms obtained for us by our forefathers and maintained for us by the men and women who have served in our Nation's military in the 240 years since that momentous day in Philadelphia. The American Legion Family at Post 117 wishes you and your family a very Happy and Safe 4th of July!
